Founded in 1909, Tel Aviv was originally a suburb of the ancient port city of Jaffa, with which it was merged in 1950. In the first years after the founding of the state of Israel, the Twin City was the seat of government. Tel Aviv-Jaffa is considered one of the largest economic metropolises in the Middle East.

WHAT KIND OF GEOGRAPHY IS THERE IN TEL AVIV?

Tel Aviv is located on the Israeli Mediterranean coastline. It lies on land that used to be sand dunes.

The city is located 60 kilometers (37 minutes) northwest of Jerusalem and 90 kilometers (56 minutes) south of the city of Haifa. A trip to the Dead Sea takes about two hours. The surroundings of Tel Aviv are mostly flat, but after Jerusalem, the landscape becomes more hilly. There are wooded areas, but due to the high density of settlements and traffic, you will find little attractive nature here.



FUN THINGS TO DO:

1. Visit the old city of Jaffa with beautiful ancient buildings and a port
2. walk along the Taylet-Walk: a long promenade by the Mediterranean Sea
3. Visit the Tel Aviv Museum of Art
4. discover the Carmel market where you can buy fruits, vegetables and spices
5. relax at one of the 13 official beaches and enjoy the beautiful weather
